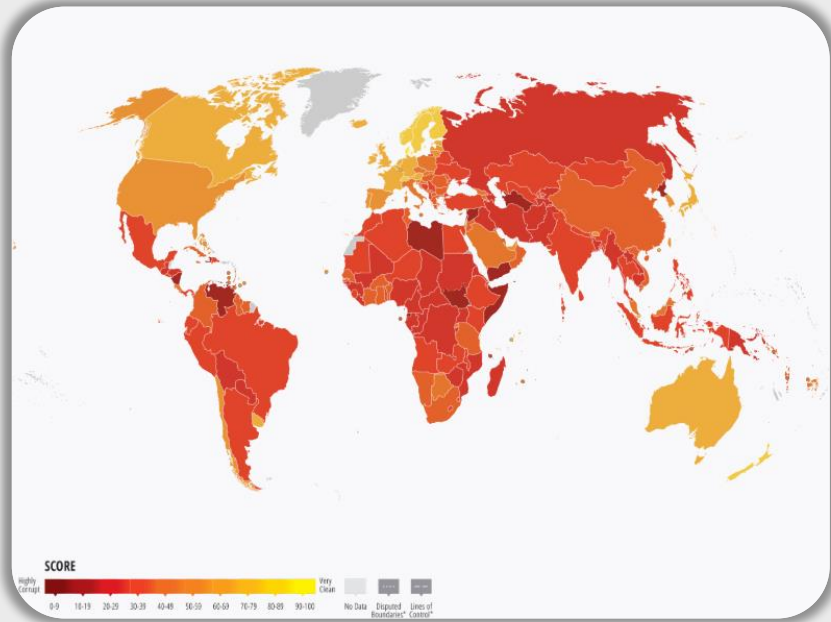
# Countering corruption...an urgent need to endorse a **systemic approach**



## Premises:

- Harmonized regulations between countries.
- Coordination between levels of government within countries.
- Shared values on the magnitude and relevance of corruption as a global problem.
- Cooperation through best practices' exchange and capacity-building networks.

## Main findings:

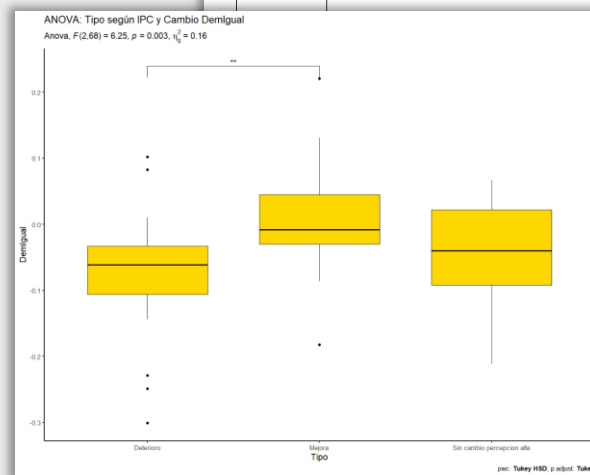
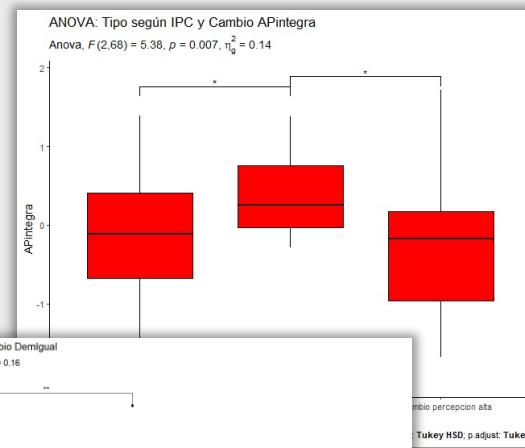
- Tackling corruption has not proved to be sufficiently effective
- Stagnation, and some countries have even worsened their scores.

# Which variables are effective reducing corruption perception?

**Results?** Countries that foster electoral participation and secure **effective access to public services** were successful reducing negative perceptions.

**What is needed?** Actions and strategies that reinforce public institutions and betting on checks-and-balances

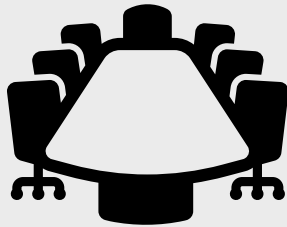
*Anticorruption should always be built on an institutional soil*

*“We need to invest in open marketplaces where anticorruption technological developments such as **preventive algorithms, risk-management tools** and **network-analysis software** can be available to all”*



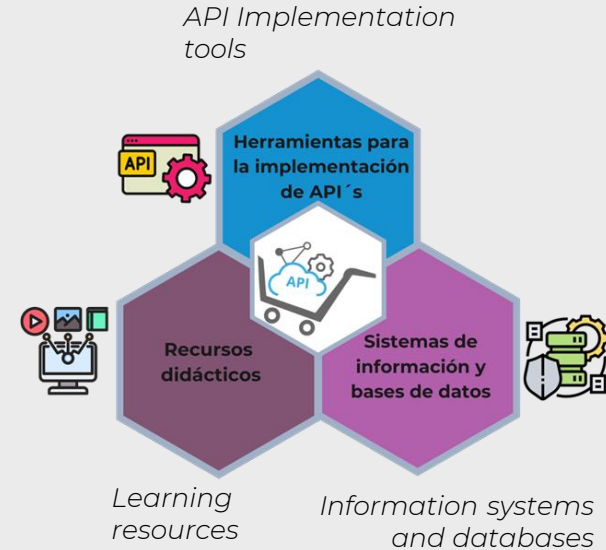
